WGU Indiana scholarship rewards high performers at Ivy Tech Community College

Ivy Tech Dean's List Scholarship helps students earn their bachelor's degree

INDIANAPOLIS – WGU Indiana is offering an exclusive scholarship to students who have earned a spot on Ivy Tech Community College's dean's list. The [\\$2,000 Ivy Tech Dean's List Scholarship](#) is for Ivy Tech students who have made the dean's list and would like to earn a bachelor's degree from one of WGU Indiana's undergraduate online programs in business, healthcare, IT or education.

“Being on Ivy Tech's dean's list tells us a student is committed to academic success,” said WGU Indiana Chancellor Allison Barber. “Once they've graduated from Ivy Tech, these students have the determination it takes to excel in our competency-based undergraduate degree programs. They can apply the knowledge they've already acquired and get on the fast track to degree completion.”

The scholarship offers savings on top of WGU Indiana's already-low tuition rates and will be credited in increments of \$500 per every six-month term, renewable for up to four terms. Students who have earned an associate's degree from Ivy Tech can move seamlessly into one of WGU Indiana's bachelor's degree programs.

“This scholarship recognizes our students' drive and their achievements,” said Sue Ellspermann, president of Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana. “Ivy Tech's areas of study align so well with WGU Indiana's degree programs, and I know that our students will continue to be successful as they pursue the next step of their educational journey with the university.”

Ivy Tech students who qualify for the Ivy Tech Dean's List Scholarship have until March 1, 2018, to apply. They must first submit an [admission application](#) to WGU Indiana.
